

1 Look at the following two learner-generated sentences, both of which contain a mistake. For each sentence:

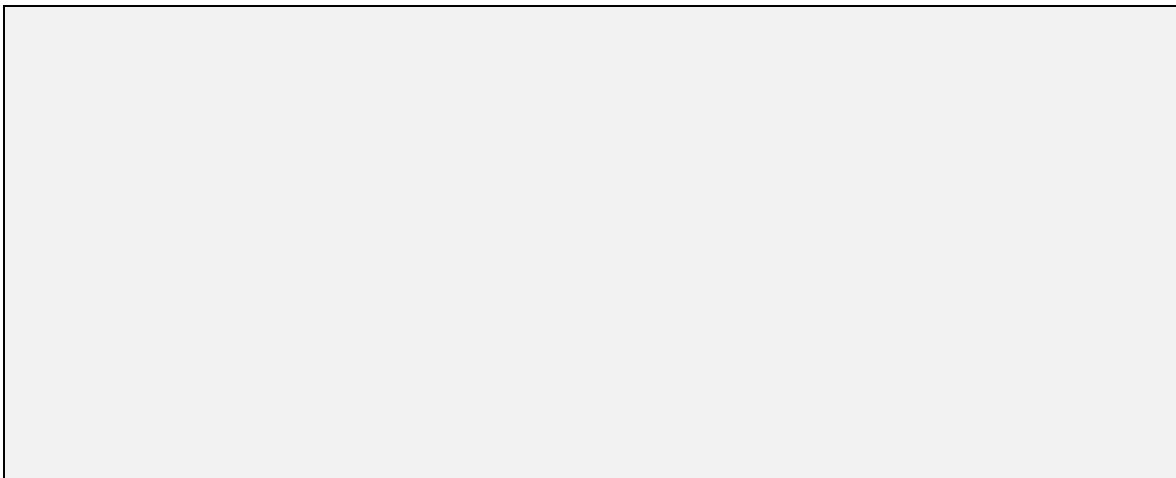
a correct the mistake

c suggest a classroom activity to help the learner with the mistake.

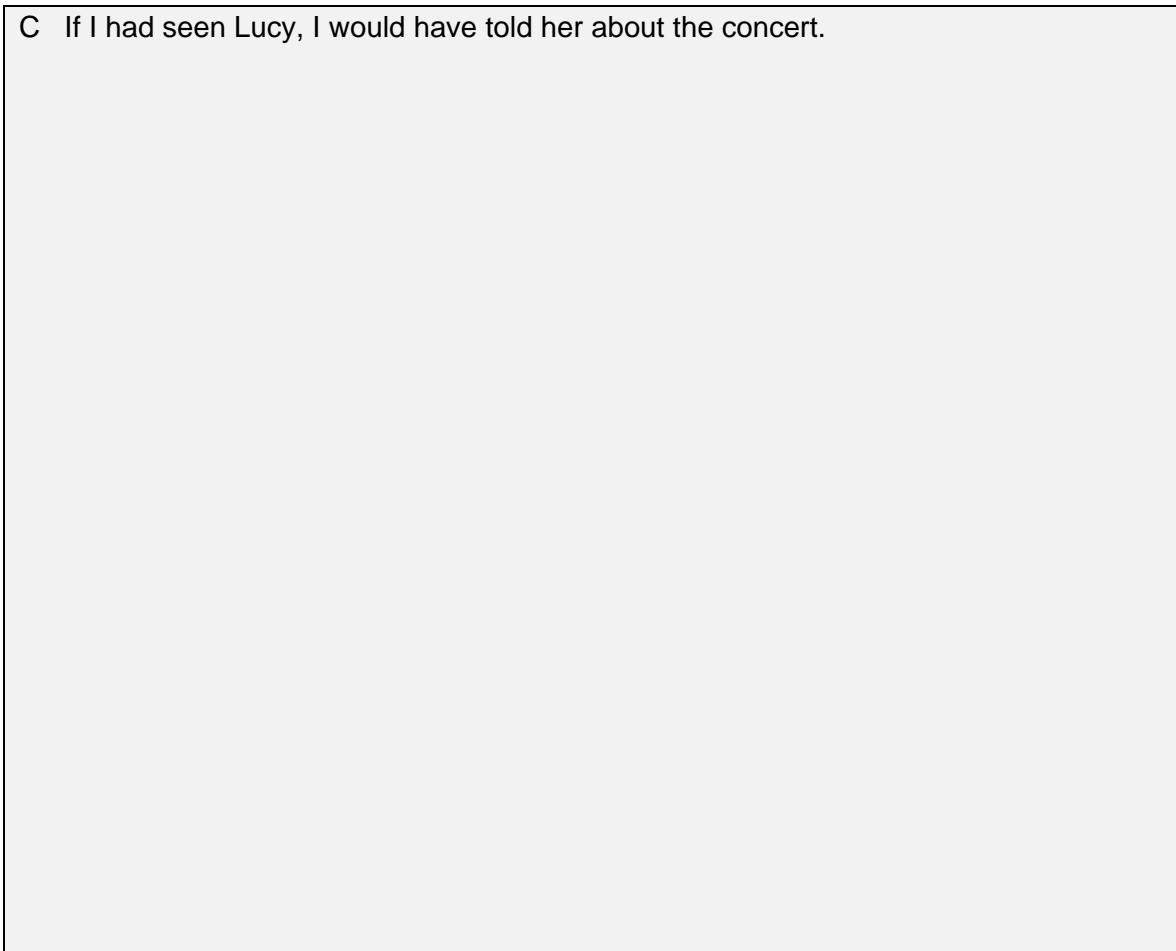
